5	Section 2306(h)(2) of title 38, United States Code,			
6	is amended—			
7	(1) by redesignating subparagraphs (A) and			
8	(B) as clauses (i) and (ii), respectively;			
9	(2) by striking "If the Secretary" and inserting			
10	"(A) Except as provided in subparagraph (B), if the			
11	Secretary"; and			
12	(3) by adding at the end the following new sub-			
13	paragraph (B):			
14	"(B) In the case of a deceased individual referred to			
15	in subsection (a) who is cremated and for whom an urn			
16	or commemorative plaque is furnished under paragraph			
17	(1), the Secretary may also furnish a headstone or marker			
18	for the individual if—			
19	"(i) the individual is interred at the same burial			
20	site as another individual referred to in section			
21	2402(a) of this title;			
22	"(ii) the headstone or marker furnished in-			
23	cludes information about both such individuals; and			
24	"(iii) the inclusion of such information does not			
25	increase the cost of the headstone or marker beyond			
26	the maximum amount permitted under law.".
