3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Homeless Veterans
5 with Children Reintegration Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PRIORITY UNDER HOMELESS VETERANS RE-**
2 **INTEGRATION PROGRAMS FOR HOMELESS**
3 **VETERANS WITH DEPENDENTS.**

4 (a) PRIORITY FOR HOMELESS VETERANS WITH DE-
5 PENDENT CHILDREN.—Subsection (a) of section 2021 of
6 title 38, United States Code, is amended—

7 (1) by striking “Subject to” and inserting “(1)
8 Subject to”;

9 (2) by redesignating paragraphs (1) through
10 (5) as subparagraphs (A) through (E), respectively;
11 and

12 (3) by adding at the end the following new
13 paragraph:

14 “(2) In conducting programs under this section, the
15 Secretary shall prioritize the provision of services to home-
16 less veterans with dependents.”.

17 (b) ADDITIONAL REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.—Sub-
18 section (d) of such section is amended—

19 (1) by striking “the report an evaluation of
20 services” and all that follows and inserting “each
21 such report—”; and

22 (2) by adding at the end the following:

23 “(1) an evaluation of services furnished to vet-
24 erans under this section and an analysis of the infor-
25 mation collected under subsection (b);

1 “(2) an analysis of any gaps in access to shel-
2 ter, safety, and services for homeless veterans with
3 dependent children; and

4 “(3) recommendations for improving any gaps
5 identified under paragraph (2).”.
