3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the "Gun Suicide Preven-

tion Act". 5

6 SEC. 2. LABELING REQUIREMENT.

- 7 (a) **PROHIBITION.**—Notwithstanding the exclusion of 8 firearms from the definition of consumer product in sec-9 tion 3(a)(5)(E) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15)
- 10 U.S.C. 2052(a)(5)(E), it shall be unlawful for a manufac-

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turer or retailer to sell or offer for sale any firearm that
 does not meet the requirements of subsection (b).

- 3 (b) NATIONAL SUICIDE PREVENTION HOTLINE 4 LABEL.—A firearm meets the requirements of this sub-5 section if a clear and conspicuous label is attached to the 6 firearm or appears on any packaging of the firearm and 7 on any descriptive material included with the firearm 8 that—
- 9 (1) is written in both English and Spanish;

10 (2) in English, reads "IF YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW IS CONTEMPLATING SUICIDE, 11 12 CALL THE NATIONAL PLEASE SUICIDE 13 PREVENTION LIFELINE AT" followed by the 14 toll-free phone number of the National Suicide Pre-15 vention Lifeline, maintained by the Assistant Sec-16 retary for Mental Health and Substance Use under 17 section 520E–3 of the Public Health Service Act (42 18 U.S.C. 290bb-36c), or any successor to such toll-19 free number; and

20 (3) contains a yellow triangle containing an ex21 clamation mark that appears immediately before the
22 words "IF YOU" on the label.

23 (c) ENFORCEMENT.—A violation of the prohibition in
24 subsection (a) shall be treated as a violation of section
25 19(a) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15 U.S.C.

2068). Any person who violates subsection (a) shall be
 subject to the penalties set forth in section 20 and 21 of
 such Act (15 U.S.C. 2069; 2070).

4 (d) RETAILER DEFINED.—In this section, the term
5 "retailer" includes a dealer, as such term is definition in
6 section 921(a) of title 18, United States Code.

7 (e) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This Act shall take effect on
8 the date that is two years after the date of enactment of
9 this Act.
