 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Climate-Friendly Food
- 5 Label Task Force Act".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds the following:

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(1) 10 percent of the greenhouse gas emissions
 emitted by the United States come from the agricul tural sector.

4 (2) Sustainable agricultural practices that re5 duce greenhouse gas emissions and prevent deforest6 ation will be critical to preventing the Earth from
7 reaching 1.5 degrees Celsius warmer than pre-indus8 trial levels, the threshold that would result in cata9 strophic climate-related effects.

10 (3) Improving the agricultural sector's impact
11 on the climate is a vital component of efforts by the
12 U.S. to meet its contributions to the Paris Agree13 ment.

(4) The USDA Organic label represents a successful model for using a voluntary, market-based
approaches to driving innovation in the agricultural
sector and successfully created a robust organic
market in the United States.

19 (5) Market-based approaches like USDA Or20 ganic can spark significant economic benefits includ21 ing jobs, and new, higher revenues for farmers.

(6) In 2021, organic farming totaled
\$11,200,000,000 in sales, created opportunity for
17,445 organic farms, and 28 percent of organic
farmers planned to continue to grow their level or

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organic production. A similar voluntary, market based approach to climate-friendly agricultural prac tices could create comparable economic benefits for
 farmers and workers.

5 SEC. 3. STUDY OF CLIMATE-FRIENDLY CERTIFICATION FOR 6 AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS.

7 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established an advi8 sory panel to carry out the study described in subsection
9 (c).

(b) MEMBERS.—The advisory panel established
under subsection (a) shall be composed of members appointed by the Secretary of Agriculture and shall include—

14 (1) representatives—

- 15 (A) that are scientists, including experts16 on climate science and nutrition science;
- 17 (B) of environmental advocacy organiza-18 tions;

19 (C) of industry, including food manufac-20 turing and farming; and

(D) of other stakeholders, as the Secretary
of Agriculture determines appropriate; and
(2) at least one representative from each of the
following:

25 (A) The Department of Agriculture.

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1	(B) The Environmental Protection Agency.
2	(C) The Centers for Disease Control and
3	Prevention.
4	(D) The Food and Drug Administration.
5	(E) The National Academy of Sciences.
6	(F) Any other Federal agency the Sec-
7	retary of Agriculture determines appropriate.
8	(c) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 1 year after
9	the date of the enactment of this Act, the panel shall sub-
10	mit to the Secretary of Agriculture and Congress a report
11	that includes—
12	(1) recommendations regarding the development
13	of a climate-friendly certification for agricultural
14	products that—
15	(A) moves agricultural producers toward
16	reducing greenhouse gas emissions on a lifecycle
17	basis; and
18	(B) uses market-based approaches that al-
19	lows for greater consumer choice and education;
20	(2) how such a certification would measure—
21	(A) the life-cycle greenhouse gas emissions
22	of agricultural products;
23	(B) the water usage in production of agri-
24	cultural products;

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(C) the land use effects of agricultural
 products; and

3 (D) any additional criteria the panel deter4 mines appropriate.

5 (d) PUBLICATION.—The Secretary of Agriculture
6 shall make the report required under subsection (c) pub7 licly available on the website of the Department of Agri8 culture.

9 (e) MORATORIUM ON USE OF CLIMATE-FRIENDLY 10 CERTIFICATION DURING STUDY.—The Secretary of Agri-11 culture may not issue any regulations or guidance or oth-12 erwise certify or advertise any agricultural product as cli-13 mate-friendly before the date on which the report required 14 under subsection (c) is submitted to Congress.
