Dear President Trump,

We write to express deep concern about reports that the Trump Administration is considering eliminating the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Division of HIV Prevention within the National Center of HIV, Viral Hepatitis, STD, and Tuberculosis Prevention (NCHHSTP). Scaling back or eliminating this division will result in thousands of new cases of human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) in the United States, opening the way for babies to be born with HIV, costing the federal government and taxpayers billions of dollars, and leading to unnecessary deaths across the country.

On February 5, 2019, you declared a commendable and ambitious goal of ending the HIV epidemic (EHE) in the United States. One of the pillars of your initiative, as shown on CDC's website, is prevention. It is imperative that you uphold this commitment. As CDC has currently identified, we must prevent new HIV transmissions through proven interventions, including pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP), if we are to achieve a 90 percent reduction in new infections by 2030.

Prevention provides a large return on investment for the federal government – adjusted for inflation, a lifetime of medical costs for a person with HIV can be over \$500,000.4 Losing the CDC's Division of HIV Prevention would be an enormous loss to HIV providers. The only other major dedicated source of HIV/AIDS funding is the flagship Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program, which statutorily is unable to cover services for people who are not already diagnosed with HIV/AIDS and thus cannot cover any prevention-only services. If this funding is eliminated, state budgets that are already stretched thin will be unable to completely replace these lost resources the federal government provides.

Nationally, there has been a 12 percent reduction in HIV incidence between 2018 and 2022. The EHE initiative at the CDC has resulted in a 21 percent reduction in HIV incidence in EHE

jurisdictions, primarily attributed to increases in PrEP prescriptions.⁶ Eliminating preventive HIV funding will result in tens of thousands of HIV cases and cost billions in lifetime HIV-related medical costs.⁷

As Members who serve the public, it is our duty to not only protect Americans from avoidable disease and early death, but to also avoid unnecessarily spending billions in taxpayer dollars down the line when HIV rates eventually skyrocket due to this potential action. Just last week, Congress passed a Continuing Resolution, which continues funding levels from Fiscal Year 2024, that appropriated funding to CDC for carrying out HIV/AIDS programs. Accordingly, we expect CDC will continue to carry out those programs.

We urge your administration to reconsider any plans to eliminate or reduce federal HIV programming. The Division of HIV Prevention makes America safer, healthier, and more prosperous, and the lives of millions of people depend on it.

Thank you for your attention to this matter, and we look forward to your timely response.


